Beginning Rock Guitar

Learn basic "licks" and chord progressions, as well as some history of this great American tradition of the blues.

Beginning Flamenco Guitar

Flamenco has been referred to as the "Spanish blues" – soulful, evocative, and just a lot of fun to play! A fantastic and fun look into the history of the guitar!

(Should be Childbloom "Tunes" level or above, ASTA grade 2 or above, or Royal Conservatory Book 2 or above. It is highly recommended, though it is NOT required, the student know basic chords in root position.)

Chord Chemistry

Learn the basic root position chords, sing-along songs, and strumming and pick patterns.
